## "Pearl Harbor Survivor to Attend Remembrance Ceremony"

Oshkosh AMVETS Post #7 will host the 2024 Pearl Harbor Remembrance ceremony at the Elks Lodge located at 175 West Fernau Avenue in Oshkosh, WI. The ceremony begins promptly at 7: 55am on Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup> 2024. The event Master of Ceremonies is LTC (ret) Michael Hert. In attendance will be Rolland Briar, who is 102 years of age, and he served on the USS Whitney. Sharing his story, is his daughter Bettye Briar-Tilot. This Remembrance Ceremony will honor those who perished in that horrific attack that occurred in Pearl Harbor whereby over 2,400 American service members perished in a surprise attack conducted by the Japanese Imperial government on December 7, 1941. Lily Krueger, a student at Winneconne High School, will lead the ceremony in Song. Students from Valley Christian School, will read the names in memory of those Wisconsinites, who died at Pearl Harbor, while a bell tolls. A Rifle Salute will be conducted at the conclusion of the ceremony. The general public is encouraged to attend.
