

## **How do I obtain a FREE photo ID to Vote?**

### **Wisconsin Act 23 requires the Department of Transportation to provide free ID cards:**

The department may not charge a fee to an applicant for an identification card if the applicant is a U.S. citizen who will be at least 18 years of age on the date of the next election and the applicant requests that the card be provided without charge for purposes of voting.

Any Wisconsin resident who does not hold a valid photo license from Wisconsin or another jurisdiction may request a photo ID at any **DMV Service Center**. When applying, it will be necessary to provide:

1. **Proof of Name and Date of Birth** – for example, a certified U.S. birth certificate, valid passport or certificate of naturalization
2. **Proof of Identity** – a document with a signature or photo
3. **Proof of Wisconsin Residency** – Pay Check Stub with your name and Wisconsin address, Utility bill for water, gas, electricity, or land-line telephone service at least 30 day old, account statement at least 30 day old from a financial institution, certified school record or transcript, mortgage documents for residential property in Wisconsin, Forward Wisconsin ID Medical Assistance Card (acceptable for proof of Wisconsin residency without your residence street address on it), and Wisconsin Quest Card (acceptable for proof of Wisconsin residency without your residence street address on it).
4. **Proof of U.S. citizenship** – legal permanent resident status, legal conditional resident status or legal temporary visitor status
5. **Your social security number**
