## What does an Administrative Associate do in the ADRC?

The ADRC of Winnebago County and the Children's Voluntary Services Program (Family Support Team) are blessed to share two administrative associates: Dawn Gillett and Robin Schwartz. Robin primarily works with the ADRC while Dawn primarily works with the Children's Voluntary Services Program. This is a program that works with families who have a child with a disability.

Robin has been employed with Winnebago County for 12 years. She has worked in the ADRC for 11 years. Dawn has worked for Winnebago County since 2017.

Robin and Dawn are the first point of contact when someone calls or walks into the ADRC. They effectively communicate and interview the customer in order to route the them to the appropriate worker. Robin and Dawn excel in customer service and are compassionate and kind when triaging the many calls that come to the ADRC every day.

Robin assists our 14 ADRC staff with a variety of tasks. One important one being that she processes paperwork for the State's long-term care programs - Family Care and IRIS. She also assists our Adult Protection team with paperwork related to Annual Protective Placement Reviews.

Dawn assist workers in the Children's Voluntary Services Program in gathering intake information from parents, obtaining medical records, and supports the 10 Service Coordinators on that team.

# **Dublin Coddle Recipe**

#### Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 medium onions (thinly sliced)
- 4-ounce piece salty back bacon (weigh after the rind removed)
- 6 traditional pork sausages
- 2 carrots (peeled and finely sliced)
- 8 ounces white potatoes (finely sliced)
- Salt (to taste)
- Freshly ground pepper (to taste)
- 2 cups rich beef stock (or chicken stock)

#### Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 F
- In a large frying pan or skillet, heat the oil. Add the onions and cook over a medium heat for about 4 minutes.
- 3. Cut the bacon piece into 1/2-inch cubes. Add the bacon to the onions and stir well.
- 4. Cut the sausages in half and add these to the onion and bacon
- Raise the heat and, constantly stirring, cook until the sausages start to brown. Take care not to burn the onions.
- 6. In a heat proof casserole, place a layer of the onion, bacon, and sausage mixture followed by the layer of sliced carrots and then a layer of potato. Season with salt and pepper.
- 7. Repeat the layering until used up, finishing with a layer of potato.
- 8. Carefully pour over the stock
- 9. Cover with a lid or a double layer of aluminum foil
- 10. Place in the center of the oven and cook for 45 minutes. Take a peek to make sure the coddle isn't drying out. (If necessary, top up with a little boiling water but don't flood the stew).
- 11. Lower the heat to 350 and cook for a further 30 minutes, until bubbling and the potatoes are thoroughly cooked.
- 12. Remove from the oven and rest for 10 minutes before serving.
- 13. Serve with hefty slices of Irish soda bread and butter to soak up all the lovely juices in the dish, as is the Irish way, and enjoy!

**March 31**<sup>st</sup> is deadline for the Medicare General Enrollment Period for people who need to enroll in Medicare Part A or B. This is also the deadline for the Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period for people in Medicare Advantage plans who want to change their coverage. If you have questions on this, please call the ADRC and speak with one of our Benefit Specialists for free assistance.

## **Wisconsin Emergency Rental Assistance (WERA)**

- Offers both rent and utility assistance. WERA will be providing utility assistance for renters, including paying on arrearages.
- Effective Feb 22<sup>nd</sup> to Dec 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Contact: Advocap at (920) 426-0150.
- Individual has to have applied for Energy Assistance (EA) first before WERA could help. They do not have to be eligible, but have to have applied and denied. This is because Advocap will use the same computer system when determining WERA assistance. The number to apply for EA is #1-800-506-5596 or www.energybenefit.wi.gov.
- This is similar to WRAP (Wisconsin Rental Assistance Program) that was in place in 2020.
- While WERA will use the same one-month test period for income eligibility as WHEAP, WERA applicants will be asked to provide income documentation for the prior two-month period.
- WERA is able to serve ineligible non-citizens who are not eligible for WHEAP benefits.

Our ADRC is still operating! We are available for appointments via: phone conference, Zoom call, and home visits if necessary. If you feel you need to see someone in person, it is best to call ahead versus just walking into our agency at this point yet during the pandemic. We are excited to see you all soon!

# FREE TAX HELP!

AARP: AARP (American Association of Retired Persons) assists with free, simple tax preparation every year. If you have a complex tax situation, they may ask you to seek aid from an accountant or tax preparer. Per the AARP website: "AARP Foundation Tax-Aide provides in-person and remote tax assistance free of charge to anyone, with a special focus on taxpayers who are 50 or older or who have low to moderate income. Tax-Aide volunteers are located nationwide, and are trained and IRS-certified every year to make sure they know about and understand the latest changes and additions to the tax code."

VITA: VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) helps with free, simple tax preparation every year. If you have a complex tax situation, they may ask you to seek aid from an accountant or tax preparer. This is available for low-moderate income individuals; the maximum income level is \$56,000/ year.

- 100% Virtual Option
  - You need internet connection, an email address and images of your documents
  - Go to website www.filetaxes4free.org
- Valet Option
  - Meet with an intake specialist and their volunteers prepare your return
  - Pick up return when ready (5-7 business days)
- Do-It-Yourself Option
  - Online service if you confidently feel you can do on your own
