AARP welcomes Oshkosh as nation's 482nd Age-Friendly Community

Madison, Wisconsin – AARP Wisconsin today announces that the City of Oshkosh & Surrounding Areas has been officially accepted as the seventh Wisconsin member of the AARP Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities.

The Network is an affiliate of the [World Health Organization's Age-Friendly Cities and Communities Program](#), an international effort launched in 2006 to help cities prepare for rapid population aging and the parallel trend of urbanization. The program has participating communities in more than 20 nations. An age-friendly community is livable for people of all ages.

The AARP Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities helps participating communities become great places for *all* ages by adopting such features as safe, walkable streets; better housing and transportation options; access to key services; and opportunities for residents to participate in civic and community activities.

Sam Wilson, State Director of AARP Wisconsin, said "We're incredibly pleased to welcome the City of Oshkosh & Surrounding Areas as a member of the AARP Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities. Oshkosh & Surrounding Areas join nearly 500 communities across the country that are actively working toward making their town, village, city, county or state a great place for people of all ages."

"Oshkosh prides itself on committing to many age-friendly practices," said Oshkosh Mayor Lori Palmeri. "In addition to talking about it, the city has committed resources to age friendly living through fall prevention programs, robust senior center resources, supporting accessible housing, and

inclusively welcomes multi generational living, working, learning, and recreation in the community.”

Healthy Lifespan Supervisor Alana Erickson from the Winnebago County Public Health Department added, "Data shows that a sense of belonging and inclusion are related to better health outcomes. While the concept of Age-Friendly Communities seems simple, it is a very intentional commitment with strategy and measurements. At WCHD we are excited this initiative will bring service providers, policymakers and residents together to improve decisions directly impacting their environment. It's not just about saving money preventing chronic conditions, it's expanding the notion of 'my community' to more residents."

Bill Topel, PsyD Winnebago County Human Services Director, said, "We are extremely pleased that the City of Oshkosh has been added to the list of AARP Age-Friendly Communities in Wisconsin. We will continue to work with other communities in Winnebago County to hopefully get all municipalities to join the list. A big thank you to all who have participated in this important accomplishment. Winnebago County cares deeply about its seniors and it shows."

Oshkosh & Surrounding Areas join six other Wisconsin communities that have earned the Age-Friendly designation, including Greendale, La Crosse, Madison, Sheboygan, Shorewood, and Wausau.

“We know from our research at AARP that 80 percent of older adults want to stay in their communities as they age, and Oshkosh & Surrounding Areas are at the forefront of making sure our communities are not only great places to grow up and work, but are also thriving areas for older adults,” Wilson said.

Oshkosh & Surrounding Areas have taken the initial steps to enter the Network, which demonstrates its commitment to actively engage in an inclusive cycle of continuous improvement in the “8 Domains of Livability” that the World Health Organization has identified as influencing the health and quality of life of older adults.
