Annual Satisfaction Survey Results—Summary

Park View Health Center sent out the Annual Nursing Home Satisfaction Survey to residents <u>or</u> resident representatives in April. The purpose of the survey is to:

- Measure satisfaction in relation to Park View's facility, services, and staff.
- Identify trends for the purpose of improvements.

Of the 120 surveys sent out, 69 or 58% were returned.



Of the responses:

- 100% stated "yes" staff welcome and accommodate visitors, when able.
- 96% responded they are "always" or "usually" satisfied with resident info timeliness and receipt.
- 98% responded that "always" or "usually" staff handle challenging situations in an appropriate manner.
- 97% answered they were "always" or "usually" satisfied with activities and leisure opportunities.
- 93% stated they were "always" or "usually" satisfied with the dining experience.
- 100% responded they "always" or "usually" are satisfied with access to personal funds and information.
- 100% of those who answered stated they are "always" or "usually" pleased with the care.
- 100% stated they would recommend Park View to someone needing care.

Areas of focus:

- Improving participation in resident decisions with daily choices/ preferences.
- Continued improvement in satisfaction with the dining experience.
- More regularity in receiving drinks and snacks between meals.

BREAKFAST ON THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Park View Health Center has been easing into the goal of prepping and serving residents' meals in neighborhood dining areas after years of planning for a more homelike dining experience. This plan was thwarted last year and into this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. There were long delays in getting each neighborhood set up with proper ventilation, as a result. Contractors could not be allowed into the facility to remove cabinetry and install the commercial-grade range hoods until a few months ago.

The ventilation systems are now in place, and this new and improved meal time is gradually being introduced one neighborhood at a time, starting with breakfast. By going about the process in this way, tweaking can be done before moving along to the next neighborhood.

The importance of providing this *much improved* dining practice for our residents will be well worth the steady process and the additional staff training it will take to get there.
