Sexual Behaviors and Winnebago County High School Students

What are the issues?

• **18.4%** of students reported it was important to them to delay having sexual intercourse until they were married.

•31.5% of students reported that they have had sexual intercourse.

• **5.7%** of students reported that they had sexual intercourse for the first time before or at the age of 13.

•10.2% of students reported that they have had sexual intercourse with 3 or more people in their lifetime.

• **5.1%** of students reported that they have had sexual intercourse with 2 or more people in the past 3 months.

• 6.7% of students reported drinking alcohol or using drugs before the last time they had sexual intercourse

• **85.6%** of students report they have been taught about HIV/AIDS in school
