Bring the original and all copies, along with your payment by cash, check or money order (payable to "Clerk of Courts") to the Clerk of Courts office, 415 Jackson Street, Oshkosh WI –Room 110. There may be a wait in line before working with a clerk. Once you are with a clerk, the process can take 30 to 45 minutes.
