## Media Invited to Visit Walk-In Vaccine Clinic

### Pre-Register to Visit the Free Vaccination Clinic at Sunnyview Expo Center for Walk-In Wednesday

**OSHKOSH, Wis., April 19, 2021** – Winnebago County Health Department will host a walk-in clinic at Sunnyview Expo Center (500 E County Road Y, Oshkosh, WI) Wednesday, April 21 from 8am-3:45pm. Media is invited to visit during our Walk-In Wednesday clinic and receive a tour. Media pre-registration is required. #### About the Clinic:

**Appointments are NOT required.** Vaccination is open to all individuals aged 18 and older. The clinic will be administering the Moderna vaccine, which is a 2-dose series vaccination. Participants will need to return for a second dose on May 19th. You will be considered fully vaccinated 14 days following the second dose of your vaccination.

"We are continually reevaluating the best way to serve our community. We hope offering this walk-in clinic will allow more people an opportunity to be vaccinated," stated Doug Gieryn, Winnebago County Health Department Director/Health Officer. "As always, we encourage our community members to get vaccinated, continue wearing masks, and social distancing to stop the spread of COVID-19 and return to a more normal way of life."

If you have received a vaccine within the last 14 days or have a history of an observed anaphylactic reaction to an injectable medication (if you needed epinephrine or an epi pen after an IV or injection), do not attend this clinic We encourage you to work with your healthcare provider.
