## FREE COVID-19 VACCINE AT THE OSHKOSH FARMER'S MARKET

Vaccination Available to Anyone 12 Years and Older This Saturday

**OSHKOSH, Wis., June 9, 2021** – The Winnebago County Health Department, in partnership with the Oshkosh Area School District, will offer a free COVID-19 vaccination clinic during the Oshkosh Farmer's Market this Saturday, June 12, from 9 a.m. to noon at the Time Community Theater (445 N Main St., Oshkosh, Wis.).

**Appointments are NOT required.** Vaccination is open to all individuals aged 12 and older. The clinic is offering both the Pfizer and Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccine. Pfizer is a 2-dose series vaccination. You will be considered fully vaccinated 14 days following the second dose of your Pfizer vaccination. Johnson & Johnson is a 1-dose vaccination. You will be considered fully vaccinated 14 days following your vaccination.

"Working with community partners like the Oshkosh Area School District helps us reach more people, especially our marginalized populations, as we continue to strive for our statewide goal of 80% of our population fully vaccinated," stated Doug Gieryn, Winnebago County Health Department Director/Health Officer. "Winnebago County currently has about 46% of it's population vaccinated, so we still have work to do."
