Weapons and Winnebago County High School Students

What is the problem?

- **13.1%** of students reported having carried a weapon such as a gun, knife, or club during the past 30 days before the survey.
- **5.3%** of students reported having carried a gun during the past 30 days before the survey.
- **5.1%** of students reported having carried a weapon **on school property** during the past 30 days before the survey.
- **5.0%** of students reported not going to school because you felt you would be unsafe at school or on your way to or from school during the past 30 days before the survey.
- During the past 12 months before the survey 6.9% of students reported that someone threatened or injured them with a weapon on school property.
