Walk-In Wednesday COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic Relocated to Coughlin Center, This Week Only

OSHKOSH, WIS. (September 14, 2021) – The Winnebago County Health Department's Walk-In Wednesday COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic, typically located at Sunnyview Expo Center, will be temporarily relocated across the street to the James P. Coughlin Center on Wednesday, September 15. Hours remain the same, with free COVID-19 vaccinations offered from 1 to 6 p.m. The James P. Coughlin Center is located just across the street from Sunnyview Expo Center at 625 E. County Road Y, Oshkosh, Wis.

Moderna, Pfizer and a limited supply of Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccines will be available. All three COVID-19 vaccines are subject to availability. Vaccination is open to all individuals, 12 years and older. Appointments are not required. Nurses are also available to answer any questions people may have.

The \$100 vaccination reward program, offered by Governor Evers and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, has been extended through September 19. Any Wisconsin resident who receives their first COVID-19 shot between August 23 and September 6 will receive a \$100 Bank Rewards Card. Find more information at dhs.wisconsin.gov/covid-19/100.

Additional info about the vaccines:

- Anyone under the age of 18 needs to have a parent/guardian present.
- Moderna and Pfizer are both a two-dose vaccination series.
- Johnson & Johnson/Janssen is a one-dose vaccination.
- Individuals are considered fully vaccinated 14 days following the completion of their vaccination series.
- People who are [moderately to severely immunocompromised](#) are recommended to get an additional dose of an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna).

Free transportation assistance is available to individuals in Winnebago, Outagamie and Calumet counties who need transportation or help navigating transportation options to their COVID-19 vaccination appointments.
