- Coordinated an interactive event with Governor Evers and the Main Street Alliance and the ColorBold Business Association concerning business owners of color in Northeast Wisconsin. - Facilitated workshops with two graduate students from UW-Madison through the Grasslands 2.0 Project, named Just Transitions in Agriculture, including other Extension Educators, organizers, and farmers of color in the Midwest. The workshops address issues, needs, and ways to collaborate in strategic directions with increased opportunities to pursue agriculture in inclusive and sustainable ways.

- Club visit to 4-H Friends, Ridgeway, and Golden Oak to evaluate and present certificates on implementing the 6 tenets of the WI 4-H Movement. These clubs encourage youth to find sparks, respect and appreciate each other, have meaningful youth-adult-partnerships, help youth learn new skills, introduce them to new experiences, and give back to their communities.
- Numerous skill building project meetings took place in February for foods, dairy, rabbit, poultry, clothing, and dog.
- Youth enrollment has exceeded last year's numbers by almost 5%.
- Summer camp registrations are coming in. Camp counselors have begun lesson planning (camp activities) and learning about ages and stages of working with younger youth.
- YAC (Youth Advisory Committee) meeting took place. Eight new youth are serving on the committee and participating as youth leaders in various committees, project education, and planning fair activity stations.
- We have 7 new volunteers in the process of being trained/approved.
- Fun Day was a success! Almost 80 youth participated in activities such as sewing, natural resources, rocketry, LEGO robotics, photography, slime science, baking, soap carving, and woodworking.
